The NAEE Curriculum Award

The National Association of Economic Educators will accept entries for its 2020 curriculum awards from May 1 to July 31, 2019. Gold, Silver, and Bronze NAEE Curriculum Awards will be granted to creators of exceptional resources for teaching economics, personal finance, and/or entrepreneurship in grade levels K-5, 6-8, or 9-12. Winning entries will be selected based primarily on creativity, and accuracy of content. Submit entries in the form of lessons, videos or podcasts, or online programs. Submission Deadlines: By July 31, 2019

Online entries must be submitted by midnight CDT, **July 31, 2019**. Mailed entries must be postmarked by **July 29, 2019**. Award winners will be notified by email by September 30.

Award Criteria

To be eligible for consideration, each submission must meet the following criteria:

- The resource must be original work.
- The content is accurate based on national standards in economics, personal finance, and/or entrepreneurship.
- The content is age appropriate, based on grade-level standards and benchmarks.
- Concepts and areas of debate are treated impartially.
- Students are asked to use higher-order thinking skills.

- Single lesson (one class period) Multiple-lesson series (multiple class periods)

4. Complete the entry form (including a 500-word resource description).

- Attach the entry form to your resource as the cover sheet.
- Label/number each submitted item as follows (using the first author's name on the entry): Last name, first name, email address, [insert sequential number] of [insert total number of items] (e.g., Dough, John, JNDough@email.net, 1 of 2)

6. Submit a processing fee per submission of a curriculum piece, defined as a set of materials to be judged separately:

\$100 each for a single submissions of a lesson or for fewer than 10 connected lessons to be judged as one piece; \$200 for a submission of 10 or more lessons or for a textbook or equivalent to be judged as one piece.

Online: Submit electronic payment using either credit card directly on the website or PayPal at paypal@naee.net. Include your name and for "**curriculum awards**" in the payment memo.

Mail: Include a check payable to the **National Association of Economic Educators**.

The NAEE's primary focus is economic education. The majority of its members have a master's degree or PhD in economics. The NAEE also includes practitioners in economic, personal finance, and entrepreneurship education engaged as lesson producers, curriculum developers, and/or teachers. Entries will be judged by committees of current NAEE members. All entries are judged according to scoring rubrics developed by the organization. Submissions are not judged relative to each other. Any number of awards may be granted. The NAEE reserves the right, however, to refrain from giving an award in a certain category in any given year. The NAEE is not responsible for entries lost in transit.
